Studying fiction texts approved by The Holocaust Trust: *Once and After the War* which focus on human struggles and fights for dignity. *Refugee Boy* and *The Bone Sparrow* explore refugees in crisis. *The Curious Incident of the Dog in the Night-time* and *A Monster Calls* explore dignified decisions.



Solidarity

A Christmas Carol and *Blood Brothers* explore standing shoulder to shoulder with your fellow man.



Stewardship

Poetry is explored in every key stage that celebrates nature as a gift from God.



Participation

At GCSE, students study *Romeo and Juliet* and delve into the human condition and our duty to try and shape a better society.



The Common Good

Multi cultural poetry is studied in KS3 with students bringing poetry from their own cultures. Art of rhetoric giving students opportunities to hone their spoken skills about injustices.



Rights and Responsibilities

The dignity of human life, human rights and social justice seen across the key stages in various books. Discussing current affairs and global issues and understanding collective responsibility to speak out in support. *My name is Leon* – responsibility to stand up for those in care.
